

Tonga is 'All In'

AFL Tonga is enjoying a swell of interest and support since the Australian Defence Force Sports Official workshops in March.

AFL Tonga Development Officers and Volunteer coaches have been out in the community delivering school programs in **Liahona High School, Tailulu College, Toloa College and Apifoou College** with an estimated **400 kids** participating in programs over the past three months.

The coaches have also been out working in the districts of Vahe Hahake, Vahe Loto, Vahe Hihifo, and Vahe Nukualofa to prepare teams to play in AFL Tonga's first ever district competition. The competition started with a bang on May 27th with 3,000 people attending the opening round, including Australian High Commissioner Her Excellency Ms Rachael Moore. The competition will culminate with finals in early July.

An open Saturday morning program has also been operating since March with over **300 regular players** arriving in the early hours before sunrise for training and games. What commitment!

AFL Tonga has formed a new **committee** to drive the vision of the organisation.

Naurus **U15 Youth Cup** came to its finale in April with the **Lions** overcoming a strong **Panzers** team 9. 7. 61 to 8.7.55 in the Grand Final with **Her Excellency the Australian High Commissioner Dr Helen Cheney** attending. Congratulations to players and coaches!

The U15 Youth Cup was a huge success with 150 boys participating. The competition was also used to identify the first Level 1 Boys **National Talent Academy** squad, click <u>here</u> to see the selection announcement, congratulations to all players and the districts they represent!

As for the **U15 girls**, Nauru Academy Coaches will be getting out, into schools to run **Talent ID programs** to select the first Level 1 Girls National Talent Academy squad, good luck coaches and players!

Continuing on Talent Academy news, **U19**National Talent Academy players have not rested since the Talent Camp in March, with both Male and Female Squads training 4 times a week, preparing to play PNGs U19 Talent Academy teams in **Brisbane** on the 5th of July which will be streamed live on **Clutch TV**.

Part of the U19 Academy teams' preparation where exhibition games on **Constitution Day** (20th of May), where AFL Nauru organised Male and Female combined senior teams to play against U19 National Talent Academy Teams. Unfortunately these games where postponed.

Wrapping up a busy few months is the start of AFL **Nauru's Senior Womens** competition which kicked off on the 10th of June with four teams competing over 6 weeks.

Grand Finals & School Development

AFL Vanuatu's Womens Senior competition came to a thrilling close with the formidable **Freswota** beating a gallant **Grand hotel** 2.3.15 to 1.2.8. A third-place game played prior saw **Mele** claim the bronze over **Tassiriki**. The competition was a great showcase of AFL Vanuatu's support of women's sport with **Inspector Lily Joel** of the Vanuatu Police Force, who is a partner of AFL Vanuatu's Gender Equity program 'Plei Footy Blo Jenis' (PFBJ) attending to hand out medals.

Speaking of **PFBJ**, this year sees the program enter schools for the first time to engage and motivate students to be active through footy and to stand up against gender-based violence (GBV) through education with the Vanuatu Police Force. Since **March** AFL Vanuatu and the Vanuatu Police Force have visited 4 schools, engaging with over 500 students, with plans turning to schools in Pango and Mele over the next few months.

Continuing on the school theme, AFL Vanuatu invited local PE Teaches and youth community leaders to attend a **Level 1 coaching and umpiring courses** held in March. The courses held at Lycee High School and facilitated by **AFLQ** staff, **Dan Cordwell** and **Lachlan Martyr** gave, 26 teachers and community leaders the opportunity to complete their Level 1 coaching and umpire certificates with the goal of each participant starting a Pikinini Kik program within their local school or communities. The **Vanuatu Police Force** also attend to present on the work they are doing with AFL Vanuatu on GBV.

A highlight from the past few months was the **Pikinini Kik** program run for Port Vila's Northern Ward in support of VASANOC. Through this program 50 kids were exposed to our great game.

AFLPNG Development National Talent
Academies are in full swing with **560 players**training throughout its 6 regions (POM, WNB,
ENB, NI, Lae, Highlands). Each centre will
have a focus on the **Regional Academy**Carnivals to be held from June 28th - July
4th. Carnivals locations are, Kimbe, Lae and
Port Moresby with Academy teams playing
against each other in age groups from U14U18.

National Talent Academy Coaches also have their eye on the **U19 International** game against **Nauru** in June with new National Academy Manager **Prudence Sindriwen** working closely with her team to make final squad selections. These games against Nauru will be streamed live on **Clutch TV**.

The Academy might get all the attention, but the real stars are the **AFL PNG Development staff** who are promoting the game through the Smart Start Niukick program. This year is really humming. Since January the development team have:

- Run Smartstart Niukick programs across AFL PNG Developments 7 regions.
- Held a Gala Day in Mt Hagen
- Started School competitions in the Port Moresby,
 Lae and Mt Hagen
- Took a boat across to Salamaua to deliver community school programs following the dawn service on ANZAC day.

From January to May a total of 23,885 Smart Start
NuiKick kids have participated in programs PNG wide,
ensuring the next generation of talented players are
raring to go.

AFL PNG is also working hard to support and develop its talented coaches with Southern Region Development Manager and Talent Academy Coach **David Topeni** invited to travel to Cairns and work as the Assistant Coach of the **Indigenous & South Pacific** representative side who played against a Carins All Starts team in May, This was a great opportunity for David to further developing his coaching skills as he goes through his Coach AFL accreditations. And for the Umpires, AFL PNG hosted an online **Umpire Mentor series,** presented by the AFLQ Umpire department. **26 Umpires** attended the mentor series which was delivered over 5 nights through April, May and June, At the completion of this mentor series the umpires earned their basic umpire accreditations.

Senior competitions are well and truly underway in Lae and POM with over 30 teams competing in POM and 6 in Lae. At the time of writing Lamana Dockers are leading the Division 1 POM Men's and Womens leagues, with University Tigers leading the reserves competition. While in Lae, the Swans sit in first spot with a 4 point buffer over the Salle Dogs.

Gold Coast Suns player **Hewago Paul Oea**, also known as "**Ace**" visited the international schools of **Gordons, KoroBoro**, and **Ela Murray** to promote his extraordinary story and his amazing rise to playing for the Gold Coast Suns and scoring a goal with his first touch in the AFL.

Finally, congratulations to PNG Mozzies International Cup Champion & AFL PNG Talent Academy Graduate **Laurie Logo** who has been selected in the South QLD Representative side to take on North QLD.

Going Regional

AFL Fiji Development Officers have left no stone unturned spreading our great game by supporting **Fiji National Sports Commission** programs that visit **regional** and **remote** parts of Fiji.

Since April the team have visited Mokani Village, and the Naitasir schools of Nabua Topline and Viria Village School, plus the districts of Nadera, Nakelo and Rewa. A highlight being the opportunity to work with 188 students from schools in the Rewa District, with AFL Fiji Development Officer Loata Vakausausa saying, "it feels amazing to help these kids learn the core skills of AFL, and to see the joy in their faces."

Another fantastic opportunity the Fiji National Sports commission programs provide is the chance to work with special needs schools. AFL Fiji Development staff worked with **164 students** from Nadi Centre for Special Education and Lautoka School for Special Education in May.







Community is truly at the heart of what AFL Fiji do which is encapsulated by its **Family Fun Day** the organisation is running on the 1st of July, pushed back from is original date of 17th of June due to wet weather. The day will be held at Albert Park with partners, sponsors and players all invited to enjoy a Bula Kick program amongst the plethora of other fun activities.

On top of all this, **30 player** between U14-U18 have been in training 3 times a week as part of a Pre-National Talent Academy Training program, preparing players for the start of the **National Talent Academy** which will be official launched later this year.

The U19 South Pacific Talent

Camps took place in March where 47 players (23 female, 24 male), 6 coaches (2 female, 4 male), 3 umpires (2 female, 1 male) and 4 Academy Managers (2 female, 2 male) attended in what was a real highlight of the year so far, That Pacific Sports Show on the ABC where on hand for games against the **Brisbane** Lions Academy teams and filmed and interviewed several participants. PNG ADF Visit

In partnership with Australian Defence Force the AFL will be traveling to the PNG cities of Port Moresby and Lae, from 24th to the 29th of July to facilitate coaching, umpiring and medical workshops as they did in Tonga (Mar) and Fiji (Nov).

By the end of this week, AFL PNG are aiming have **30** level 2, and **60** level 1 coaches completed the course, **with** an additional **60** umpires completing their level 1.

The AFL workshop facilitators will also attend academy trainings and community game days

Five blazing trails

As part of the **AFL South Pacific Talent Academy** pathway, five players (three from PNG, two Nauru) have recently found a home at community clubs within Australia.

AFL PNG have supported their charges as follows:

- **Kelly Kaula** and **Glen Saniong** playing for Nhill & District in regional Victoria
- **Kila Rawali** playing for <u>Manunda Hawks A.F.C</u> in Cairns

While AFL Nauru's players are both in Queensland

- Voss Baguga playing for Mt Gravatt Vultures' Colts (U19s)
- **Febulous Kanth** playing for Beenleigh Womens 2nd division

All five have been part of the PNG and Nauru National Talent Academy Programs. Player live locally, and support the local community and play for their clubs in their local leagues.

The experience is vital to development and growth of the game back in each players country as players will bring home the lessons and skills learnt to share with their country men and women. These placements form part of the AFL South Pacific **High Performance Pathway** which is proudly supported by the Australian Government's **PacificAus Sports** program.



Highlights

Febulous has been leading the way for Beenleigh - sometimes getting plenty of attention from opposition enforcers (13 free kicks her way in one game alone!) but always a valuable performer and best on in four games so far.

Voss has improved in every match and against Surfers Paradise set up four goals in a consistent performance.

Glen and Kelly both put in great games against Minyip Murtoa - Kelly with three goals and Glen a mountain of tackles, blistering pace and crisp handballs.

Kila is becoming a cult figure at Manunda Hawks with strong performances through the midfield and half forward.
