The Wyong Lakes ruck duo of Rebecca Ives and Kanesha Murray have been in unstoppable form for the unbeaten Magpies outfit this season, and Golledge thinks that these two will provide quality ball for followers such as Amy Pittman, Jocelyn Kelleher and Alexandra Pearce.

Golledge advised that "Ives and Murray have very different styles of play. Ives is, in many ways, an old-fashioned tap ruck whilst Murray uses her outstanding athletic ability to great effect, using a great natural jump, even though she sometimes jumps off two feet".

Co-coach Nathan Harkness says that the Men's side has been chosen specifically "to get a really good team group, top level players that are super keen to play, fit, and versatile."

Harkness explained that a premium has been placed on superior fitness and form. "We have made a conscious decision to make fitness a priority, with Pasterfield being such a big, expansive ground. We have gone for skilful players, and with our more senior players, we have placed an emphasis on experience".

Harkness stated that being able to have five players on the bench (it has been agreed that both sides can field 23 players) means that AFLHCC can choose 2 specialist ruckmen; "we may not have gone with a second ruckman if we were restricted to 22 players, because of the size of the ground, but the extra man on the bench opens up a second ruck spot for either of Brayden Tos or Billy Barton, behind (2018 Elliott Davey Medallist) Tim Oosterhoff'.

Harkness advised that Tos and Oosterhoff "can both play key position as well as ruck, which gives us flexibility. Marcus (DeLeur) can also swing into the ruck if required".

Harkness stated that "we want to have a really simple game plan. We have chosen a series of smaller, running players who can really make difference, especially on the spread and switch.

All of our smaller players are quick and experienced, which makes them very valuable assets".

Conor Haswell's utility value will be a key for Harkness and co-coach Tim Cotter. "Haswell uses the ball very well, he has great skills and he is really brave through the corridor".

Bryce Graetz is "just your old-fashioned, no-frills, put your head over the ball on-baller, he never lets you down, same as Mac O'Malley, who played really well against AFL Canberra last year".

Women

Today is a historic moment for AFL South Coast as the league plays its first ever Women representative game when they take on the strong AFL Hunter Central Coast league in Newcastle. In only the second year of a Womens competition in the region, Co-Coaches Geoff Gibbs and Ben Hyndes are confident their team will put up a great display against what will no doubt be a very strong AFL HCC side

Leading the players will be Wollongong Lions' Jordan van de Voorde who has the honour of being the inaugural AFL South Coast Womens Captain. Jordan will be ably assisted by Jessica Thomas from the Bomaderry Tigers as Vice-Captain.

Bomaderry Tigers young gun Sophie Phillips will be one to watch after spending last weekend playing with the U18 NSW/ACT Rams up in Coffs Harbour. Phillips took all before her in 2018 being crowned the inaugural Maddy Collier Medallist for the Leagues Best and Fairest player along with her Best on Ground performance in the Tigers premiership. Shellharbour sharp shooter Shellee Gibson and Lions key forward Jacqueline Wilson will provide the AFL South Coast Women with great targets up forward.

Down back the side will be looking for direction from van de Voorde and Romy Bradmore from the Wollongong Bulldogs who has been in great form all year. In the centre keep an eye out for the Wollongong Lions ruck Mikaela Allen and the dynamic runners in Emma Dowse and Bridget Kellett from Bomaderry.

Men

2019 saw a new format implemented in the selection of the AFL South Coast Men's Representative side compared to previous years. The starting point for the squad was the players selected in the 2018 AFL South Coast Team of the Year which was then added to with those players who have stood out in the early part of the 2019 season. This list of near 40 players were then put through their paces in a series of training sessions since the start of May. 2018 Premiers Kiama Power and Wollongong Lions make up the bulk of the team with the addition of players from Figtree, Bomaderry and the Bulldogs.

AFL South Coast will again be led by Wollongong Lions ruckmen Rohan Watson who admirably led the team in its last fixture. The work rate and toughness of the South Coast midfield led by the Lions Ben Green and Kiama's Jack Mahony and Nick Baggio will be important. Speed and skills on the outside are a strength of the side with the likes of Jack Boxsell, Ben Williams and Matt Price hoping to get plenty of the pill in space. The Lion's duo of Sam Wilson and Jake Hogarth , are a power up forward

The talented and adaptable Callum McFadden who has returned to the league will be one the side look to around the ground for direction while the Bulldogs Aaron Jory wins plenty of the football, to turn defence into attack. AFL South Coast is under no illusions about the strength of AFL HCC, who in recent years have proved themselves as clearly the third strongest league across NSW and the ACT. AFL South Coast have won their last six representative encounters and for some years have tried to organise a fixture against one of the top leagues so this match up will really test the waters and the strength of the league.
