Each Parent and Supporter understands and agrees to:

- Do not use remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability as many such comments are politically incorrect and it is your Coach, team-mates, Club and family that are let down with such remarks;
- Respect the facilities and equipment of their own and opposing Clubs;
- Do not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any Player, Official, Umpire or supporter. Such actions are totally unacceptable;
- Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, Coaches, Officials or Players;
- Refrain from using abusive language.
- Not to enter the field of play in any sanctioned Competition Match unless granted permission by an Official to do so;
- Not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media;
- Not make or post inappropriate, offensive or discriminatory comments in public, including via social media, about Players, Clubs, Umpires, Officials, the AFL or the League. Social media includes, but is not limited to, email, instant messaging, text messages, phone messages, digital images, website postings (including social media such as Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, websites and blogs);

Nelson Bay have struggled in the opening nine rounds of the AFL Hunter Central Coast Women's Premiership. Consigned to short player numbers after injuries and absences robbed them of a full squad, the Marlins started their season with seven losses.

Now the minor premiers from last season have started "reaping the rewards" from their battles through the player-count woes, scoring their second win in as many weeks as they downed Gosford 53-16 at Adcock Park on Saturday afternoon.

"These wins have been great rewards for the efforts the girls have been putting in all season, they've been well deserved" Marlins coach Dean Purtle told the *Chronicle*.

"We have a very small squad this time around because of absences and injuries, so every week it's a struggle playing with low numbers but we've managed to do it. Not only that, but the girls have gone out there every week and played well."

The Gosford win moves Nelson Bay into twelfth with their 2-7 record. After defeating The Entrance Bateau Bay 37-28 last weekend, the Marlins now have the chance to push themselves a fair distance away from the wooden spoon position.

"It's been a pity for us that it's just been one of those years where it just hasn't come together player-wise, because the girls have been pushing so hard and working for each other," Purtle said of his barebones Marlins squad.

"The whole team gives 100 percent every single week even though some games we have 14 on the field and we're facing 16 against us and another six on the bench. I'm so proud of what the girls have done, at the end of the day they just want to play footy and it's so nice to get the reward after all the effort they've put in every game."

Also on Saturday afternoon, Killarney Vale stayed a single win ahead of the chasing pack with a 10.5-65 to 3.5-23 win over table -topping contenders Terrigal Avoca. Sian George led the way for the Bombers, slotting six, while scoring regular Ange Jones chipped in with three of her own. Morgan Ross scored two for the Panthers.

At Ferodale Park, Mihaela Simeonova led Port Stephens as best on field to a 7.13-55 to 1.1-7 win over seventh-placed Singleton. Nicole Morgan scored twice for the Power, while Cheyenne Neu scored one and was included in the team's best.


