Each Parent and Supporter understands and agrees to:

- Respect the facilities and equipment of their own and opposing Clubs;
- Do not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any Player, Official, Umpire or supporter. Such actions are totally unacceptable;
- Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, Coaches, Officials or Players;
- Refrain from using abusive language.
- Not to enter the field of play in any sanctioned Competition Match unless granted permission by an Official to do so;
- Not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media;
- Not make or post inappropriate, offensive or discriminatory comments in public, including via social media, about Players, Clubs, Umpires, Officials, the AFL or the League. Social media includes, but is not limited to, email, instant messaging, text messages, phone messages, digital images, website postings (including social media such as Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, websites and blogs);

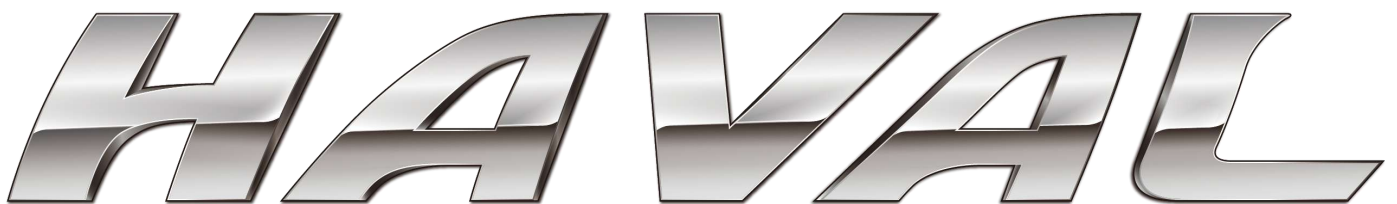

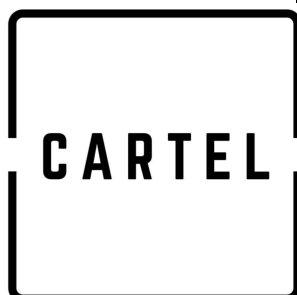

Thanks to The Cats for hosting us & well done on raising awareness for **Pride Round 2019**.

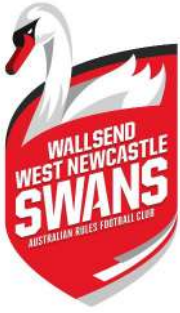

Today, Wallsend West Newcastle ARFC will celebrate its Pride Round with the Wyong Lakes AFC. The Wallsend West Newcastle Swans are very proud of this initiative and welcome our involvement. The team, via Sarah (Taco) Parker have even produced a special You-tube video of the event, with many players expressing what the Pride game means to them, so please check out this fantastic effort at: <https://pridecup.org.au/events/>.

The Swans have commissioned a special Pride Jersey for the day; and the rainbow theme (as per National AFL) will be prominent on the day (e.g. socks, flags, ground markings etc.), with all our players and supporters.

The Swans thank The Family Hotel, Newcastle Pride and Highlite Fitness which are sponsors of the jerseys, the cups and the day. We also thank the Pride Cup organisation who have supported the event through their website (<https://pridecup.org.au/events/>) and help promote the day through their social media and the design of the Pride Cup poster.

Next year's Pride Cup will be at Wyong Lakes, making this an M1 Derby Event, between the Hunter and the Central Coast. The Club will also be the official provider of Pride Cup merchandise, so rainbow items like beanies, scarfs and rainbow shoelaces will be available for purchase (from the canteen).
