SIR DOUG

NICHOLLS ROUND



Sir Doug Nicholls Round is being celebrated at community football grounds across NSW and the ACT on a scale never seen before.

More than 30 clubs and their opponents across NSW and the ACT will formally recognise the culture and contribution Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people have on our great game. The elite AFL competition celebrates Sir Doug Nicholls Round across rounds 11 and 12, with AFL HCC clubs celebrating across multiple upcoming weekends.

Many clubs in NSW and the ACT will wear special commemorative guernseys designed by Indigenous players or community members to mark the round. Smoking ceremonies and acknowledgments of country will also be held across local matches in junior and senior ranks along with cultural dance lessons, face painting and education seminars.

Head of AFL NSW/ACT, Tiffany Robertson, said Sir Doug Nicholls Round serves as important recognition of Indigenous people's impact on our game. "I am so proud this annual celebration of Indigenous culture in AFL is widely acknowledged across community clubs in NSW and the ACT," Ms Robertson said. "NSW is home to the largest Indigenous population in Australia, and this round helps us all reflect on the rich culture and contribution Indigenous players bring to our game.

"The round also serves as a reminder to the tens of thousands of footballers in this region who play on lands of deep cultural significance and history. Indigenous Australians own the world's oldest living culture and we must always respect the custodians of the grounds we play on week in week out."

AFL NSW/ACT Indigenous Ambassadors, Jeremy Finlayson and James Bell are both looking forward to the round and are pleased that it extends to community footy's grassroots.

“My Aboriginal heritage is from the south coast of NSW all the way up to Kempsey and the Bellbrook area. It’s great to see so many community clubs getting around Sir Doug Nicholls Round and celebrating the contribution Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island players have on the game.” Bell said.

“When I think of Sir Doug Nicholls Round, I genuinely get goose-bumps. This year is even more exciting as I found out from my Dad’s cousin that I am related to Sir Doug, so the round has a greater significance.” Finlayson said.

Wallsend West Newcastle ARFC (The Swans) are urgently seeking expressions of interest for the position of Women's Head Coach - AFL HCC Plate Division for the rest of the 2021 Season.

The Swans are an Australian Rules Football Club who compete in the AFL Hunter Central Coast League and based at Maryland in the Newcastle local government area. We are a small community and family orientated Sports Club supporting the Western Newcastle community. The Swans prides itself as a strong family and community club, promoting inclusion at all levels, whether it is sexuality, religious or cultural inclusion. We see diversity in sport as the future growth area for our club and as such strongly support the Pride Round to which the Club introduced the first Regional NSW Pride Cup to AFL in 2019. Historically, we have a rich history in the AFL, by being the inaugural winners of the Black Diamond Cup (Australia's oldest football trophy and the cup the premier league still plays for in Newcastle/Central Coast).

Plucka set to reach 450 Matches in the Field

Darrel is second on the all-time matches officiated list with 459 total matches, with John Sullivan (First Legend of NCCUA), with 481 matches, the only umpire to have taken the field for more matches.

"Plucka" is the only umpire to dedicate 450 matches in the one discipline, Field Umpiring, with John Sullivan umpiring 421 matches in goals, the rest were as a Field Umpire in his earlier days of the Black Diamond AFL.

A breakdown of Darrel's stats is as follows:

- 344 Cup (First Overall - Only player or umpire to reach 300 Cup Matches)
- 52 Under 18's
- 26 Reserve Grade
- 19 Plate
- 5 Shield
- 4 Women's Cup

He also ties the record for the most First Grade Grand Finals umpired by a Field Umpire with 8 (Roger Crowhurst is the other) and leads in the First Grade Finals umpired with 31 (Roger Crowhurst 25 and Ashley Borg 23 are second and third respectively).

Darrel's record, dedication to umpiring and overall love of the game saw him elevated as the third Legend of the NCCUA in 2019 (John Sullivan - 2015 and Neville Turner - 2017 the other two) and in 2020, the NCCUA unanimously voted to rename the Field Umpire of the Year trophy, the "Darrel Luck Field Umpire of the Year Award", which Nathan Slater was the first recipient of.

Darrel, you are a true legend to umpiring and the AFL Hunter Central Coast, Black Diamond AFL and Central Coast AFL previously. Congratulations on a magnificent achievement.

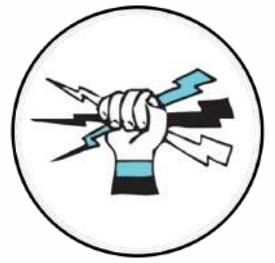

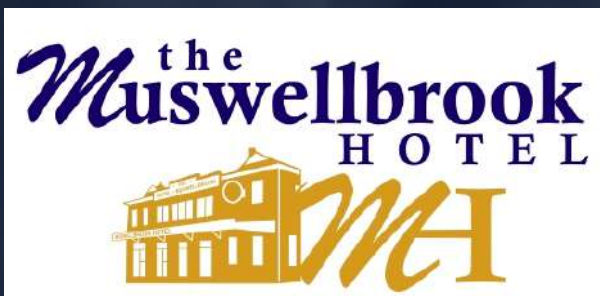
