Welcome to footy day, Saints' fans! We had a cracking weekend of football at Warners Bay last weekend with all three teams acquitting themselves well but not coming home with the biscuits. The Twos are building a solid squad with good numbers each week and it is beginning to show in the quality of their play. It was good to be hitting the scoreboard in a solid way and really encouraging for the weeks ahead. Our ladies too were very competitive with some really positive aspects of their game. Coach Sasha pulled on the boots for the first time this season and we hope it won't be the last. Our Ones gave a terrific account of themselves up until three quarter time before the score blew out towards the end but it didn't really reflect the competitiveness of the whole game. Good numbers at training now we are on our own ground and we'll see the improvement continue. President Matho wanted me to highlight a couple of aspects that we can work on with a look back at my career over the ages.

I remember back to a particularly wet season a footy around the mid 80s When I travelled with my team to Mangoplah for a top of the table clash in this round about 35 years ago. I was plying my trade for match payments of \$500 a game and playing out of the goal square because there was no clause in my contract that said I had to leave it. I had kicked 8 goals from 8 attempts with about 4 minutes left in the match and we trailed by 19 points. It was a pretty good effort at that time because the ball had only got to the goal square those 8 times. I knew my team needed something so I hastily attracted the attention of the captain coach from centre half forward and renegotiated a bonus payment that allowed me to insert myself into the middle. Over the next three minutes, I took the tap in the middle, collected the ball myself and launched 3 torpedoes over the 70 metres to goal, one of them a reverse torpedo on the left foot just to demonstrate to my young rover what I was talking about, and brought us back to within one point. With 25 seconds remaining I tapped to myself at the centre bounce once again and took the ball with two bounces to the boundary. I snapped the winning goal over my shoulder from in front of the opposition bench with the ball sailing through the goals just as the siren went. I was knackered. I wasn't paid to train. But if those midfielders from the opposition had just trained that little bit harder and that little bit longer they might just have been able to keep up with me and maybe had some effect on my kick to win the game. As I walked over to sit on the opposition bench I mentioned to their coach that I had provided a great lesson for younger players and hopefully his team would learn something from it.

It's about the training, boys and girls. Not everybody has the natural talent that I have been blessed with so it comes down to effort. President Matho just wanted me to reinforce this week that we are at the halfway point of the season and footy is fun. Training is fun. We have some great things happening at the Saints and when we get around each other and work together the synergy pushes us even further.

This week we have Newcastle city at Max McMahon Oval with another opportunity just test ourselves against the front runners. It will be awesome to be back on Max. It will be awesome to get back to our major sponsor, the Bradford Hotel, to reflect on a good day of footy. We're at the halfway point. Get around each other! Go the Saints!

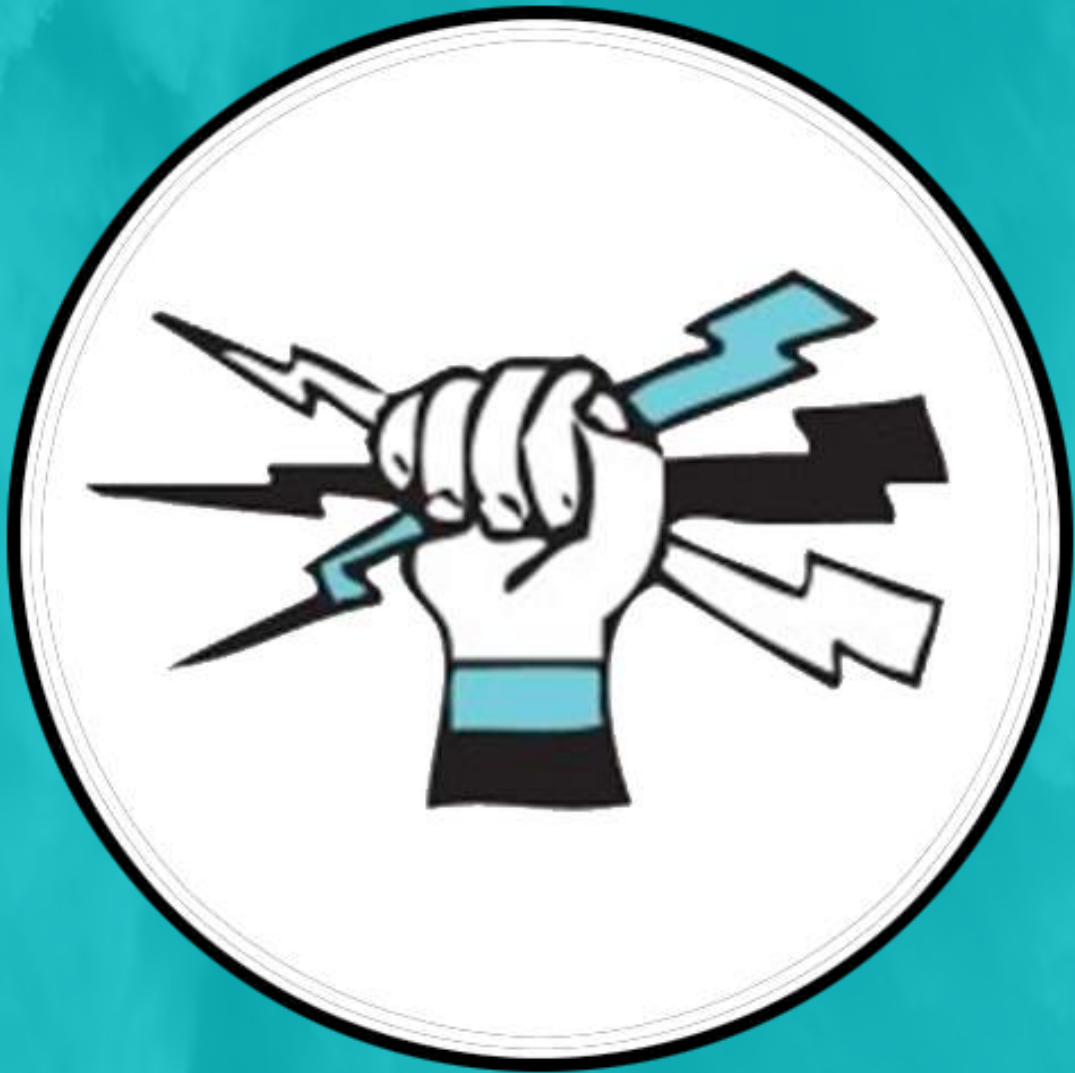
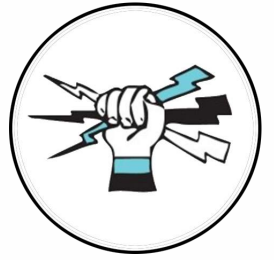

The workshop is delivered by a local psychologist and aims to help participants gain the tools to Understand, Recognise and Respond to signs of mental ill-health in their players.

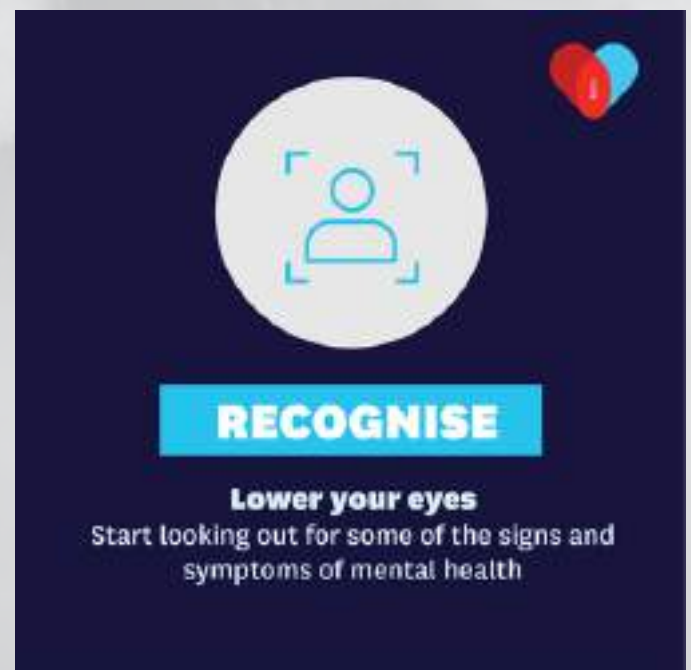
Tackle Your Feelings is based on the education delivered to the AFL industry, and is led by high profile player and coach ambassadors.
