Round 5: Sir Doug Nicholls Round on the AFLHCC

A hush falls over the ground. Smoke drifts through the air. Players and umpires line up on the ground, their Indigenous guernseys hanging heavy on their shoulders, each design a tribute to the land, the people, and the stories that have shaped them. This is no ordinary round. This is the AFLHCC Indigenous Round: where football meets culture, spirit meets skill, and every kick, tackle, and roar from the crowd writes a new chapter under much older tale.

This weekend is Round 5 for the Men's and Women's Cup teams, and the competition is loud with the anticipation the round brings. A gripping round awaits us with teams ready to show off their unique Indigenous guernseys, a week after the AFLHCC's Representative weekend came to a close. The announcement of the new Men's Cup team promises exciting prospects for the future, with fresh talent and a renewed focus on the premiership window for the rest of the season as the bye round is eliminated. It's been a week of highs and lows, but the journey is far from over, and you can read about it all, right here, right now, in this special edition of On the Mark for Indigenous Round, exclusive to the AFL Hunter Central Coast.

Representative Carnival

Last Saturday, all AFLHCC clubs enjoyed a well-earned weekend off as selected Men's and Women's players travelled to Blacktown International Sports Park for the annual Representative Carnival. In a much-anticipated double-header, AFL Hunter Central Coast faced off against AFL South Coast across both Men's and Women's fixtures.

Unfortunately, both sides fell short against strong South Coast outfits. The Women's team displayed class, flair, and determination, eager to reverse last year's heartbreaking one-point loss. While they didn't get the result, their effort and improvement were clear. The Men started with dominance, controlling the first half and putting South Coast under real pressure. But momentum shifted in the second half, and a late surge saw the South Coast overrun them in a dominating finish.

Congratulations to both South Coast sides, and we can't wait for next year, where the AFLHCC will be back, and stronger.

Men's Cup

In the Men's Cup, sirens sound. Because there's a tsunami coming in from Nelson Bay, and it's loaded with Marlins. As of Wednesday, May 7th, 2025, the AFL Hunter Central Coast has dropped a mid-season bombshell — the Nelson Bay Marlins have officially been elevated from the Men's Plate to the Men's Cup for the rest of the 2025 season.

After weeks of dominance in the reserves, the Nelson Bay Marlins are set to make their AFLHCC Men's Cup debut in a blockbuster Round 5 showdown. For those who've been watching closely, this move was only a matter of time. They haven't just won in the reserves... they've dominated their opponents. The Marlins have played three games in the Men's Plate this season, winning their first by 218 points, then by 146 points the week after, and in Round 3 they found themselves winners again by 200 points. A total margin of 564 points has been built off the Marlin's first 3 rounds.

Nelson Bay makes their first appearance against a team equally hungry for a win: Bateau Bay. In the birth of a new Bay vs Bay clash, the Marlins head to Bateau Bay, to play in their Men's Cup debut. With this addition, the bye round is eliminated. Nelson Bay has work to do, starting 8th on the table - a far cry from their dominant performances in the Men's Plate, where Newcastle City 2nds, Terrigal Avoca, Wyong Lakes, and Newcastle City 3rds round out the top four. Four Men's Cup games on a Saturday has fans excited for what's to come throughout the rest of the season.

Down on the Central Coast, an unseen powerhouse has a battle appointment with a promising Bulldogs outfit. The Terrigal Avoca Panthers have shown dominance this season, though both weather and the bye have repeatedly interrupted their momentum. Football fans were robbed of a blockbuster last weekend, when Terrigal Avoca and Newcastle City were set for a top-of-the-table clash at No. 1 Sportsground. However, rain forced the council to close the ground, and the game was called off. We have only seen Terrigal Avoca in two games in the last month. Each game has been entertaining to say the least, with their biggest win recording at 69 points. However, Warners Bay wait patiently and are 3rd on the table. Will this weekend bring an upset worthy of a ladder change up? 2.00pm Saturday is when it kicks off. It was Round 11, 2024, the last time these two met, and the Bulldogs have a score to settle.

In the Hunter, one team remains winless. The Maitland Saints have demonstrated a consistent and pleasing run of narrowing margins and perseverance. But this weekend, they face off with Newcastle City at home. Newcastle City have once again flexed their muscle as a true powerhouse of the competition. Maitland are a team brimming with confidence, but still desperately hunting for their first win of the season. From the opening bounce, Newcastle will look to assert control and practise what has worked so well that last weeks. Maitland will need to be the best version of the red and yellow storm they possess.

Finally, for the last match up of the Men's Cup: get ready for a battle in the skies. Cardiff and Killarney Vale is shaping up to be an absolute thriller. The last time these two sides met, it was a heart-stopper in Round 1, with Cardiff edging out the Bombers by just five points in a nail-biting finish. Since then, both teams have built momentum, adjusted tactics, and circled this match as one of the most anticipated fixtures of the season.

Cardiff come in with confidence, hungry to defend their home turf and prove their Round 1 win was no fluke. Killarney Vale come off just their only win of the season in Round 4, a 63 point masterclass. They're coming with a point to prove — determined, driven, and desperate to flip the script.

Women's Cup

The Women's Cup is heating up with fierce competition, rising teams, and regular finals contenders.

The first game of the weekend is one the Singleton Rooster's have had in their sights for a while. After one bye and three losses, their fourth game of the season will take place at the home of the Rooster, Rose Point Oval. That's right, the Roosters are back on home turf for the first time in 2025. Their looking to beat the team that currently sits two rungs ahead on the ladder – Bateau Bay. Singleton were recently defeated by Warners Bay in a muddy affair in Round 4, but they still have a long season ahead, with plenty of wins left for the Roosters to peck up. But Bateau Bay are looking strong, and a need a win after a second loss that did nothing to even their one win ledger.

At the opposite end of the ladder, the recent addition to the winner's circle, the Warners Bay Bulldogs meet with the Panthers, whose season has also largely been impacted by the rain. Hylton Moore Oval will be a buzz of activity as the Bulldogs search for back-to-back wins, and Terrigal knock ever louder on the 2025 premiership door. The jungle is alive with 4 legged beasts, and it will be a dog fight worthy of viewing.

Finally, a Grand Final rematch rounds out Round 5. Another battle in the skies happens at Pasterfield, with the Hawks and the Bombers ready for battle. In Round 1, the Grand Final Rematch, Cardiff missed their shot at redemption, with Killarney Vale holding bragging rights over the maroon and yellow. The Hawks are ready though. Their only loss of the season has been at Adelaide Street Oval, against Killarney Vale. Expect the Hawks to swoop with purpose. This is more than a match — it's unfinished business.

Last time they met on the big stage, Killarney Vale were crowned champions... but only just. It was a brutal, brilliant grand final that went down to the wire and the kind of game that lives in the minds of both clubs. For Cardiff, it's lit a fire that's been burning all season too long, and their eager to take back the bragging rights.

As the siren sounds and boots hit the ground, Indigenous Round is more than just football — it's a celebration of culture, a tribute to the First Nations players and communities who've shaped our game, and a reminder of the stories that echo through every kick, mark, and goal.

There's a tsunami coming in from Nelson Bay, and it's loaded with Marlins.

The Marlins have played 3 games in the Men's Plate, winning first by 218 points, then 146 the week after, and in Round 3 they found themselves winners again by 200 points. A total margin of 564 points has been built off the Marlin's first 3 rounds.

The promotion, confirmed mid-week by the AFLHCC, sends a loud message across the Hunter Central Coast competition: Nelson Bay is not here to make up the numbers — they're here to rattle the cage.

4 Men's Cup fixtures will now headline our Saturdays, and it does not get any more exciting than this. The Premiership window? Narrowed completely as 7 teams moves to 8, cancelling a weekly bye for all teams and leaving an open race for the Men's Cup.

It all kicks off at Passage Road Oval, Bateau Bay against the Bateau Bay Blues who sit 5th on the ladder.

Make no mistake, there are still questions: Will the Marlins handle the speed, the pressure, the heat of the Cup? Will the underdog story turn into a fairytale — or a cold reminder of the gap between tiers?

Nelson Bay's rise has already shaken up the system. Now, it could tear the ladder apart. Round 5. Men's Cup. Marlins unleashed. History starts now.

The following is a very special story behind Dave's magnificent artwork:

"This artwork depicts what I see what umpiring has done for me over the past 11 seasons as an umpire and the past 19 years while involved with football.

The artwork depicts three people which I see as a boundary umpire, a goal umpire and lastly a field umpire. Without these people we are unable to start the beautiful game of football. The depiction of the umpires show white lines on each of them, I see this as the history of umpiring with the old white uniforms as well as the growth that each umpire gets from every single game.

The line connecting all three umpires is the tracks of the serpent that created the hills and the rivers but also creates the fields that we play this beautiful sport on.

The lighter green lines in the background show the different land and country that we play football on every weekend. It depicts the hills and valleys that we travel through and over to watch the bounce at the start of the game.

The three gum leaves represent the change of season and how different the countries are in the Hunter Central Coast AFL."



Abrief HISTORY

Sir Doug Nicholls Round began in 2005 as "Indigenous Round" to celebrate the contributions of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to Australian football. In 2016, it was renamed in honour of Sir Doug Nicholls, a trailblazing Yorta Yorta man who was not only a VFL player for Fitzroy, but also a pastor, activist, and the first Indigenous governor of an Australian state. The round is held annually and includes cultural ceremonies, Indigenous guernseys, and the famous "Dreamtime at the 'G" match. It has grown into a powerful symbol of respect, reconciliation, and pride across the AFL and local leagues like the AFLHCC.

The AFLHCC is proud to have an Indigenous Round honouring all Indigenous players, volunteers and those apart of the AFLHCC Competition. 


RECORD Over the years

OLIVER CROFT goes back through the history books to take a look at Round 5, 2022.

Round 5 in 2022 marked several milestones on the AFLHCC. Field umpire Darrel Luck featured on the front cover of the Record, celebrating his 350th Black Diamond Cup Game as a field umpire. There were 7 Men's Cup teams, the only difference being Singleton Men's Cup instead of Bateau Bay, and 8 Women's Cup teams. However, these were not the only levels of AFL in the Hunter Central Coast, with options also available to play in Men's and Women's Plate and a Shield Competition as well.

The Bar TV Game of the Round was the Maitland Saints playing the Terrigal Avoca Panthers in the Men's and Women's Cup. Round 5 in 2022 also celebrated Community Umpiring Round, with the Record stating: "The objective of Community Umpiring Week is to increase the awareness of umpiring as a choice and as an additional activity to playing. Umpiring is a great alternative to playing, as well as a way to "get fit, get paid, have fun", learn new skills, all while learning about the game."

The Record was 40 pages in length, featuring club line-ups and small reports made by various clubs. There was a predicted cold snap of weather for the weekend, with the Lake Macquarie Dockers writing: "Winter is coming to this week's round of AFL with a bitter cold snap forecast to make it a very interesting change in conditions. With the girls starting at a brisk 9 am, it will certainly add a new challenge to their pregame contest."
